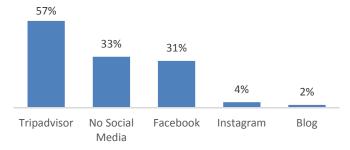

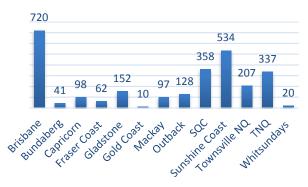

Storytelling Workshops

Visit Queensland, in collaboration with Tourism and Events Queensland, conducted a series of storytelling workshops for staff and volunteers of the accredited VIC network. Each VIC and region has a unique story to tell and the workshops are aimed at helping VICs to discover theirs and to learn how to inspire visitors from across the globe. Over 60 VICs took part in the workshops as of 30 June with the remainder of the workshops being held over the next 12 months.

Memento Project

Tourism and Events Queensland engaged Creative Economy to develop the 'Memento Procurement Guide for Visitor Information Centres'. The aim of the guide is to assist VICs to increase unique local product for sale to visitors by sourcing locally made or Australian mementos. Tourism and Events Queensland saw this as an opportunity for enhancing the experience of visitors to Queensland and improving the sustainability of VICs through increasing revenue.

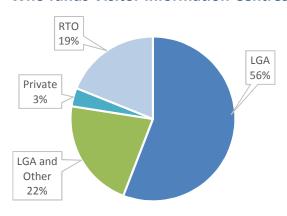

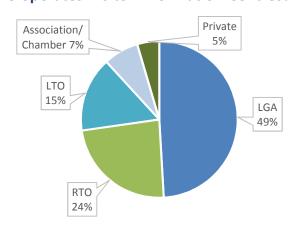

Who funds Visitor Information Centres?



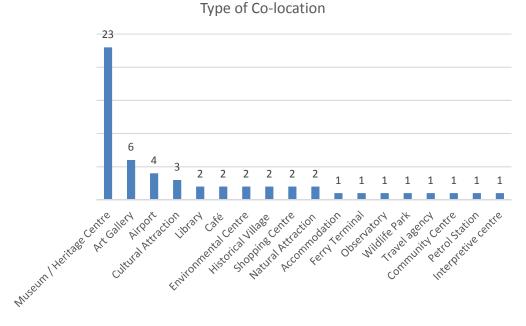
Who operates Visitor Information Centres?



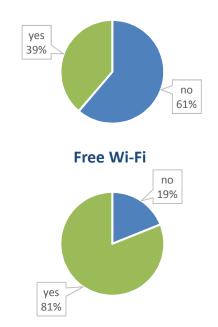
Co-location of VICs with other attractions
